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### 2020 SCHOLARSHIP ONLINE WORKSHOP (SOW)

Online workshop closes at 11:45 pm ET on February 28,2020

REAP will be processing between 8 and 30 applications for the 86211 Scholarship. Available only in conjunction with a sufficient resource level and an applicant’s participation in SOW, this \$2,500 risk sensitive scholarship is a one time and nonrenewable award, paid in two disbursements. First, \$2,175 will be sent via check payable to both the scholarship recipient and the postsecondary institution sometime between late-September and late-November of 2020. Final stage of award process will entail REAP’s receipt of a copy of each of the following: the transcripts from high school/s attended; the letter of admission applicant received from institution; and the schedule listing applicant's coursework for first term. Second, the residual award balance (\$325) will be sent to recipient after REAP receives a copy of the official academic transcript showing award of bachelor's degree.

**Eligibility:** Applicant must be a participant in the SOW who is a U.S. citizen, 17 years of age or older, and a member of their high school's AY 2019-20 graduating class who will be entering and enrolling in full-time studies in a bachelor's degree program that is delivered and awarded through a regionally-accredited U.S. institution of higher education. Individuals who already decided on attending a specific institution or who received credits as a result of a dual enrollment type of arrangement are ineligible. Participant must also possess a report of their scores from the ACT and/or SAT for upload at entry into online workshop. For the purposes of processing the application, a test score matters only in terms of its associations with metrics on each of the **three to eight institutions**. Award requires enrollment at one of the institutions that is listed in the assignment form.

**Instructions:** Participants will complete workshop assignment form (sample appears below) and will draw data for its completion from the [College Navigator \(https://nces.ed.gov/collegenavigator/\)](https://nces.ed.gov/collegenavigator/) website.

**Evaluation:** Only complete packets uploaded in workshop will undergo evaluation. Packet consists of the completed assignment form and a copy each of the participant's government-issued photo identification (driver's license, for example) and of the results from admission test/s (SAT and/or ACT). In evaluating assignments, points will accrue based on the degree to which score level aligns with metrics present in the form. The assignment from the eligible pool of participants, which earns the highest number of passing points (over 61), wins the scholarship award assuming that pool consists of eight or more participants.
